



Hook Removes Fuse. Because it usually is difficult to get your fingers on a fuse, Howard Van DeWater, Kew Gardens, N. Y., suggests that garage workers make up a fuse hook. The one shown was bent to shape from a discarded wiper arm.



Dust May Knock Out Radio. One car manufacturer has traced a number of radio failures to dust blown behind the instrument panel by mechanics using an air hose to clean a car. If your radio has been subject to such whirlwinds, remove it and suck out the dust with a vacuum cleaner. Dust in the tuner lubricant also causes binding.



Lock Keeps Hood Up. If a counterbalanced hood tends to swing down, a Cshaped hook like this may be the easiest fix. Bend it from a piece of %" steel rod. Raise the hood a bit higher than it usually hangs to put the hook around the struts. The hook serves as a lock because the struts must move apart when the hood comes down.
