


Rear air outlets installed like this will often increase the effectiveness of a heating system that draws fresh air from outside, especially if the car is tightly sealed. The circulating air also will help keep the side and back windows free from fog, keep the

trunk free from dampness and make it unnecessary to open windows.

Screens over the parcel-shelf openings prevent objects from falling through. The outlet can be a piece of square gutter pipe. Point it back to keep out mud and water.



For work under a car, a gooseneck desk lamp is an excellent addition to a creeper. Drill the base of the lamp and screw it to the creeper. Invert the shade to throw light up. The flexible neck will keep the light in the desired position.



If a mirror rattles in its frame, transparent windshield-glass sealer or a clear cement applied between the glass and rolled edge will keep it quiet. Remove mirror and place it flat to do the job. Scrape off excess cement with a razor blade.
