




# Hints FROM THE MODEL GARAGE




**When a key breaks off** in a car lock, try this trick. Smear the broken end with adhesive available from hardware stores for mounting sanding disks. Push the smeared end into the lock, then withdraw it. The adhesive may bring the tip out with it.



**A trouble light** usually has a hook only at the top, making it difficult to hang so that the light shines down. Solder a second hook to the back of the reflector, as above, and you will find that the light will be much more convenient to use.



**Storing solvent** for washing small parts and tools in a service garage is easy this way. A fabric cover keeps dirt out of the metal tank and you can shove the tank back under the workbench when not in use. The slide is made of  $\frac{1}{2}$ " rod.



**If your trunk won't close** because you're hauling too much in it, here is one way you can secure the lid. Cut a rubber band from an inner tube, fasten one end under the lid and the other to an eyebolt locked with nuts to the license plate.
