



A file case for maps will keep them orderly and within easy reach. An old mail box with the cover removed makes a slim holder. Make two cuts in the back at the top, bend over a flap, and hang the box on the edge of the scuff panel.






A pouch for tools will double the usefulness of a spare-tire cover. Just tack it to a piece of plywood. A clip screwed to the plywood holds it on the wheel. When needed, the cover can be lifted out easily and carried by the clip.



Car doors take a heating from masonry walls and it's not easy to nail a protective cushion to concrete or brick. But a sponge-rubber mat cemented over plywood can be hung from a single nail driven into a weak spot in the mortar.



If you drive in rough country, you need a flexible mount for the license plate on your light truck, jeep, or other vehicle. A piece of a belt used like this will flex it the plate is snagged, keeping it from being torn loose or crumpled.
