





When removing electrical equipment, don't cut any wires until you've stuck small masking-tape "flags" on either side of the cut. Label each pair with the same number. There will be no confusion when it's time to reconnect; just match up the numbers.



Patch a leaky polyethylene windshield-washer tank with molten polyethylene. Light the end of a small piece of ¼"-diameter polyethylene tubing. Let the slow-burning tubing drip melted plastic into the crack. When hard, it's a permanent repair.



The tiny spring inside a spring-loaded ventpane lock knob is a hard item to buy at an auto-supply house. You can make a perfect replacement from the spring inside an old ball-point pen. Carefully cut the pen spring to the right length with wire cutters.
