

## More Hints from the Model Garage




Road-map distances are easy to tally by shaping a piece of 1/16" solder to follow the highway. Indent the solder with your fingernail to show the start and end of the route you are plotting; straighten it and put it on the map scale to read mileage.



On cars with sediment bowls at the bottom of the fuel pump, the easy way to disconnect the fuel line on the pressure side of the pump is to remove the bowl. In this way, the engine can be turned over without risk of gasoline running all around.



Loose packages in the trunk won't rattle around if you tie them down by means of marine cleats on the trunk walls. Fasten the cleats with self-threading metal screws. Ordinary twine will hold the packages. Marine-hardware stores carry the cleats.



Keep your road flare handy for an emergency by fitting a broom-closet clip on the door sill next to the driving seat, as shown above. One clip is usually enough to hold the flare in place, but two may be used if there is enough space for them.
